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## Brain Cancer Survivor to Compete in the Marine Corps Marathon and Rappel "Over the Edge" for Charity

BethAnn Telford will complete in two events this fall to benefit Accelerate Brain Cancer Cure (<a href="www.abc2.org">www.abc2.org</a>) and Team Kids (<a href="www.teamkids.org">www.teamkids.org</a>). Telford was running the Marine Corp Marathon (MCM) in the fall of 2004 when she felt a "pop" in her head and became disoriented, though she finished the marathon. After many tests, she was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2005, and has since endured two brain surgeries, completed three Boston Marathons, and three Ironman competitions, including the Ironman World Championship in Kona, Hawaii last year. Telford had augmentation cystoplasty surgery earlier this year for her bladder as result of her cancer and is recovering and training to win her fight against brain cancer.

To continue to raise awareness for children with brain cancer, Telford is training to compete in her 12<sup>th</sup> Marine Corps Marathon and will run the event with the help of 26 "coaches" as part of Team Kids Relay and Team Inspiration, who will run with her for each of the 26 miles. Each mile is dedicated to a child who is battling or has battled against brain cancer.
